## Multi-cultural Resource Centre (NI). General information.

### *About us:*

Multi-Cultural Resource Centre is a regional organisation working as a conduit advocating and promoting human rights and equity through empowerment, collaboration and support of Black and Ethnic Minority communities and individuals. We offer innovative responses to the needs of our service users through a variety of projects and activities, including:

- Community Development training and practical support for existing and emerging Black and Minority Ethnic individuals and groups. Liaison with local communities to provide responses to and prevention of racist attacks.
- A children and young people's project providing a range of

social activities, mentoring programmes, youth leadership training and practical skills.

- Working closely with Immigration Detainees and their families through prison visits, social activities for families etc.
- An Outreach project visiting and supporting the most isolated and vulnerable families and individuals, linking them with a range of key statutory service providers. Practical support for victims of racist attacks.
- A Linguistic Minority Development Worker that offers a range of support and help in language development of children (0-6) and their families.
- Information and networking, linking the black and minority ethnic community with the white majority community through making connections and contacts and building up support networks.
- A dedicated volunteer project where individuals receive practical training to increase employability, advocate on behalf of vul-

nerable groups and learn new skills.

- Provision of a drop-in advice / referral service on a daily basis.
- We produce research in highly specialised areas such as conditions for Migrant Workers, the Bangladeshi Community in NI, the 70+ Minority Ethnic Languages spoken in NI etc.
- Provision of tailored English language classes to suit those who cannot or are unable to access those provided by FE Colleges etc.
- Provision of Internet and email services in appropriate language formats to individuals of minority communities to catch-up on information from their home countries and also to communicate with family.
- Bi-monthly mail-outs to over 300 organisations and individuals on forthcoming events, new policies, racist attacks etc.
